Devastated Homeowners Pay Dearly For Illegal Plumbing Connection They Were Unaware Of

Early last year we were called out for a sewer backup. When our tech arrived, he discovered that a restoration company was already at the house. They were cleaning up water damage on the main floor and the basement - all damage connected to the sewer backup. But that turned out to be only the tip of a very large iceberg.

The homeowner had returned from a weekend away to a flooded house. During their few days away, water had covered the entire main floor, leaked through the subfloor, and poured into the basement.

It turned out that in the past

someone had gotten the "great idea" to tie the discharge pipe from the sump pump in the basement directly into the main sewer line.

Doing so was a convenient way to dispose of all the groundwater coming into the house sump pit. But doing so is prohibited and illegal by code. Municipalities don't want clean groundwater entering sanitary sewers, which are designed only for wastewater.

Sump pump discharge water can be pumped into a storm sewer, a ditch, or another place away from the home, but it must not be pumped into the city sewer.

Whoever did this probably assumed it didn't matter and, besides, who would ever know?

On this weekend, there was excessive ground water, in part due to snow melt. And when the main sewer plugged all the water began backing up. There were no basement floor drains to provide a relief point for the water backing up. Further the check valve on the sump pump discharge line served its intended purpose to prevent the water from backing up into the sump pump pit. So, with nowhere else to go water filled the drain lines and then was forced up the drain each time the sump pump turned on.

Eventually the water found an exit point - most likely it overflowed from the toilet on the main floor. And every time the sump pump turned on, more water flooded the main floor.

The water dispersed in all directions, ruining the floor

and anything touching it including the drywall. Plus, it rained down into the basement where it ruined the items stored there.

By the time the homeowners returned, hundreds of gallons of water had flooded their home. This was how they found it when they got home.

Unfortunately, as bad as this is, it gets worse. Their homeowner's insurance company denied their claim because it was caused by an illegal plumbing connection. There was no help for the huge clean up and restoration costs for the flooding.

How can they do that? Most insurance policies contain explicit exclusions stating that losses resulting from illegal or criminal activities are not covered. Since building codes have the power of law, failure to comply with them is considered an illegal act. In this case, the illegal connection directly contributed to the loss: Without the addition of the

groundwater being pumped from the sump pump into the sewer there would have been no water to backup and cause the flooding. In fact, without the illegal connection there would have been no need for the insurance claim that was denied.

An Ounce of Prevention is Worth a Pound of Cure'

Both the illegal connection and the roots growing in the sewer could have been discovered and dealt with before the problem occurred.

- A plumbing inspection can reveal areas where there are problems that need to be corrected.
- A video inspection of your sewer can discover problems - such as root growth - that can lead to a sewer backup.

and an HVAC installer and service tech. But he's best remembered as our long-time service & installation manager - a position he held for 27 years - from 1989 until 2016. Then at a point when most people would retire, instead Dave slowed down and moved into a part time, flex-position. Typically, he'd handle 1-2 HVAC service calls a day as they came in.

In the early years, I was mostly part time during the school year, working in the shop stocking parts bins and cleaning. Over the summer break I would work full time out in the field, and I spent a lot of time with Dave as his helper. Later my brother, David Squires, hired on and also worked with Dave as a helper. We learned a lot working with Dave, and we developed a bond that is still unbroken.

Nancy got to know my dad while she was working as a clerk at a local plumbing & heating supply house. Every time dad picked up parts and materials, Nancy would tell him that she wanted to come work for him. Eventually, she got her chance, when the original bookkeeper, Helen Archer, retired.

Nancy was hired as a bookkeeper and receptionist. She had an enthusiastic 'signature' greeting when she picked up the phone: "Vincent's Heating & Plumbing... Nancy speaking!" Over the years I heard a lot of positive comments from customers about how cheerful Nancy was when they called. It wasn't long until Nancy became the dispatcher, and many of her bookkeeping tasks were handed off to others as Vincent's Heating & Plumbing grew.

After earning a B.S. in Accounting from Walsh college, I transitioned from the field into the office and became General Manager. ALL WATER HEATERS:

- Per WATTS T & P relief valve inspection guidelines:
- Perform T & P valve annual safety check to prevent explosions.
- Verify T & P valve installed correctly and for safe discharge.
- Verify T & P valve is rated correctly for the tank.
- Remove T & P valve and visually inspect for corrosion and accumulation of sediment deposits to make sure it will work.

ATMOSPHERIC & POWER VENT GAS WATER HEATERS ONLY:

- Flush sediment from tank to reduce health risks & prolong tank life (*flushed until water is clear.*)
- Perform visual inspection of anode rod, dip tube and tank interior for signs of wear.
- Exhaust vent safety check to prevent CO leaking into house.
- Perform flame safety check to prevent gas explosions.
- Clean air intake grill to ensure proper & safe performance.
- Perform safety inspection of all gas fittings to it for leaks.

TANKLESS GAS WATER HEATERS ONLY:

- Perform annual descaling flush.
- Perform safety inspection of all gas fittings to it for leaks.

ELECTRIC WATER HEATER ONLY:

- Flush sediment from tank to reduce health risks & prolong tank life (*flushed until water is clear*)
- Perform visual inspection of elements, anode rod, dip tube and tank interior for signs of wear.
- Remove access panels.
- Visually inspect all electrical connections.
- Visually inspect for signs of copper embrittlement.

PLUMBING INSPECTION

- Check all water line shut offs and emergency stops to verify they will function when needed.
- Identify location of main shutoff and make certain that it works.
- Examine drain lines & water lines for signs of leaking and concerns.
- And more....
