
combined issue. Vincent's News will return in February.

Humidity, Comfort, and Energy Savings - Part 2

In Part 1, we looked at how controlling the amount of humidity in your home can have a direct impact on your heating and cooling bill. Decreasing humidity in your home during hot summer months means you can feel more comfortable (cooler) at a higher thermostat

setting. Increasing humidity in your home during cold winter months means you can feel more comfortable (warmer) at a lower thermostat setting. In both scenarios you save energy by making yourself more comfortable. * In either case, the humidity level is the key: In the summer, while central air conditioning will help to lower the humidity in your home, there are circumstances where a separate whole home dehumidifier is needed to do the job. For instance, if the AC equipment has too

much cooling capacity for the size of the house or if the ductwork was not engineered correctly, the AC unit won't be able to adequately dehumidify the air. Also, because your AC system needs a lot of runtime to extract humidity, if the outside temperature is not hot enough to keep your air conditioning running it won't dehumidify the air. This is especially a problem if there is high humidity on days that are moderately hot or in a house with a damp basement. These are situations in which AC is not enough and a whole home dehumidifier is the only solution.

 During cold winter months, outside air is dry and so typically the only way to add humidity in your home is to install a humidifier.

How much humidity do we

want? This is an important question. The rule of thumb is that we want to shoot for 40% relative humidity (RH) in our homes. There are a lot of reasons for that:

- Humidity levels above 50% RH can promote mold growth, are ideal for dust mites to flourish, can cause condensation on windows, can cause hardwood floors to swell, and more.
- Humidity levels below 30% RH will dry out our mucous membranes that protect us from germs and other airborne irritants. This can cause a person to have a bloody nose and lowers our resistance to things that can make us sick like cold and flu viruses.
- Humidity levels below 30% will cause items made of wood to shrink

like hardwood floors and piano soundboards, which will go out of tune more easily. Low humidity levels will also create static electricity which can damage sensitive electronic components such as computers and TV's.

The best way to monitor the humidity level in your home is with a humidity meter, which are inexpensive and a good investment. When you consider all the benefits of controlling humidity in your home - comfort, energy savings, the health benefits, and protecting your home from swelling or shrinking wood and protecting your valuable electronic devices - a humidifier and a whole home dehumidifier are a pretty good investment. 
