How to Avoid Cross-Contamination of Your Home's Water Supply

The big headlines about contaminated drinking water are typically about chemicals such as the lead in the Flint water system. But water systems in homes across the United States are

contaminated daily from cross-connections that occur because of poor plumbing practices.

The EPA defines a cross-connection as "Any actual or

potential connection between a drinking water system and an unapproved water supply or other source of contamination." Hundreds of people

across the US get sick every day with flu-like symptoms that are actually caused by the water they drink. Here are some examples of cross-connections and how you can avoid them:

Hoses left on older style laundry tub faucets that are immersed in sinks or buckets full of water pose a threat. The potential danger is that a temporary drop in water pressure – such as a water main break or a fire hydrant being used – could allow the hose to act as a siphon to pull contaminated water into the house water supply piping.

The same problem can happen with hoses left connected to outside faucets. A drop in pressure could allow the hose to siphon water from hoses left in hot tubs, swimming pools – or even puddles on the ground. Even worse, is when drinking water is contaminated from hoses that are connected to sprayers with window cleaning solutions or weed killers. Again, a temporary drop in water pressure can

cause these deadly chemicals to be siphoned into your water supply.

Newer style laundry tub faucets and outside wall faucets have built in anti-siphon protection that prevent such contamination from occurring, but it is still a good practice to remove hoses when not in use.

Modern faucets and sinks have an air-gap designed into them. Examine any faucet spout and you will note that there is a gap in the distance between the bottom of the spout and the rim at the top of the sink or tub that it is connected to. This is to avoid the possibility of any overflow from a backup reaching the spout. If you don't have an air-gap you should have this looked at by a plumber.

Another place where a cross-connection can be avoided is in your toilet tank. The head of the water fill valve (“ballcock”) needs to be above the water level in the tank. This is another example of an air-gap. Unfortunately, totally

illegal - but cheap - replacement fill-valves that do not have an air gap are available from hardware stores. These should be avoided and/or replaced. They can be easily identified because the fill valve is totally immersed underwater – there is no air-gap.

Finally, if you have an irrigation system, you should have a mechanical backflow preventer between your sprinkler system and your home's water supply system. By law – and by safe plumbing practices – backflow preventers need to be tested by a certified backflow professional annually.

Making sure your plumbing water system is safe and having your backflow preventer checked is another reason to have an annual Plumbing & Home Safety Inspection. See this month's flyer for more information.
